Jos is an underwater photographer who has built a reputation for capturing the stunning beauty of marine life and underwater ecosystems. Broere's passion for underwater photography began in the early 2000s when he combined his love for diving with photography. In addition to his work as a photographer, Jos Broere has also been active as an educator, sharing his knowledge and expertise with other photographers, recently he coached a team in the Dutch championship where they won a gold medal.

His images have been featured in various publications (Magazine Duiken, Onderwatersport and several newspapers), exhibitions (PiXlive) and National and International competitions, earning him recognition within the underwater photography community. He is also known for using state-of-the-art equipment and techniques to capture underwater images in their purest form.

Broere currently shoots with Nikon Z8 and Nikon D810 both in Isotta housings. He uses two Retra Pro+ strobes in combination with i-Turtle 2 Smart TTL trigger.
